The report of the committee on internal improvement in the Legislature of Georgia, recommends that the Board of Commissioners for Internal Improvement, as soon as the same shall be constituted, be empowered to award premiums for the following objects:—

To the person who shall deliver to the Board an effectual method of counteracting the rot in cotton and of destroying the insect called the caterpillar:

For the greatest quantity of raw silk produced by any person in Georgia from worms tred in the state:—

For the greatest quantity of merchandise being the produce of Georgia:—

For the greatest quantity of Sugar, Spanish Tobacco, Opium and valuable vegetable dyes:—

To the person who shall most successfully cultivate the greatest quantity of artificial or natural grasses in the manner best calculated to assist the farmer in rearing sheep:—

For the best experiments on the feeding of cattle in order to prove the earliest maturing and greatest propensity to fatten:—

For the most satisfactory account of the best method of improving any one of the soils commonly known among the State by the denomination of the red, the grey, and the pine woods soils.

The report concludes with the following paragraph, which is well worthy the attention of the busy politicians in every part of the country.

When your committee cannot close this report without remanding every liberal and enlightened patriot of every description derived from Dean Swift well worthy of the young and aspiring, that the man who cages two blades of grass or two stalks of corn to grow where only one grew before, is worth the whole race of politician put together:—

The negro woman Rachael, under sentence of death for the murder a white man, and who escaped from jail last spring, on the night before before the day appointed for her execution, was safely lodged in prison again on Sunday. Nothing that could be depended on was heard of her until a few weeks ago, when Sheriff Bates received information of her having been seen in Kentucky. Without loss of time he dispatched two messengers with the intelligence to the Governor, who furnished the necessary authority to procure her apprehension and return to this state. The messengers found Rachael at the residence of her master's brother, in Kentucky, and proceeded with her by way of the rivers to New-Orleans, and thence to this city, on board Capt. Vincent's Packet.

Rachael's account of her escape from jail, and subsequent movements, so far as she made disclosures to the persons having her in custody, together with other circumstances related in connection with the affair, implicates several individuals as having been concerned in the attempt to evade the execution of the laws. Their names it would be improper under all circumstances to mention at this time. The public will, of course, award the sheriff no little credit for his decision, and vigilance in the discharge of his duty, on this occasion. We presume it rests with the Court in such cases to appoint another day for the execution, without any other form or trial than to identify the prisoner.
