The bill introduced by Mr. Wyche, to mitigate the severity of executions nd for the further relief of Insolvent debtors, provides, that for all debts any crop whilst growing, except executions issuing on attachments. It further provides, that when any execution shell be levied on land, to satisfy suy debt contracted after the period above named, the crop growing, shall be deemed the property of the Defendent, who shall retain the right to secure it, but shall not commit waster or retain possession of any house. The bill provides also, that for debts bereafter contracted, 10 bushels of Corn or Wheat and 100 lbs. of Beef, Pork or Bacon, for the debtor and the same for his wife and each child, shall be exempt from seizure and excepted in the oath to be taken, or the schedule to be ren lered by say insolvent debtor.
