-WIST INDIA TRADE .- The following facts we find in an Eastern paper with regard to the importance of this trade with only one of the islands. In five years from 1821 to 1826, the exports from the United States to the Island of Jamaica alone, amounted to two and a ralf millions of dollars. The freight on these exports amounted to one million. Nine tenths of these freights were earned by American vessels, making the consumption of American produce and labour in this one island upwards of three millions of dollars.

In 1821, in consequence of the ports of this Island being closed against us, the exports from the United States were small, but during the three following years, there was a rapid increase of exports, and a corresponding decrease of exports from the British N .- An e ican Colonies. This continued until 1825-6, when the exports of the United States to the Island exceeded the whole amount of its imports, when its ports were clo sed against us. During an open trade we supplied them with articles, therefore, which, during a non-intercourse, their posts were opened to all our products, excepting fish and salt provisions many articles before prohibited were introduced in such quantities as to promise all increase of the trade had our direct intercourse with the Island conti-

In our commerce with the Island, it is further stated, we were in reality customers for its produce comparatively to a small extent. A large proportion of our imports were afterwards exported to Europe. If four years, our annual imports of Coffee increased from half a million to upwards of two millions-of Pimento we received on an average about one third of the crop-in 1825 nearly half of it. Of Rum, the average annual importation was 3400 puncheons Most of these articles were resexported to Europe, affording to our shipping two freights. Supposing that Jamaica embraced but one third of the whole consumption of the West India Islands of American produce, those islands afforded a market for the productions and labour of the United States, amounting to more than a million and a half of dodars annually.—Charleston Pat.
