STEPHEN MAZUREAU, Esq., at the suggestion of a number of his friends, has become a candidate for the Legislature, in place of Gen. Guignie, resigned.

To the remarks we made the other day, in relation to the phrase "Christian party & politics," as used by the Courier, in speaking of the friends of the Colonization society, we have little to add, and nothing to retract from what we then said.

Of the Clergyman from whom our contemporary derives his favorite phrase, we have no knowledge; nor have we ever, either by circumstance or inclination, had any connection with the sect of which he is stated to be the organ.

The petitions which have been presented to Congress relative to Sandy Mills, it is believed have emanated from no particular religious sect. Great numbers of various denominations have united in presenting them.

We do not belong to any religious sect, and are not attached to, or under the influence of any religious or charitable society; yet we do entertain a sincere respect for the Christian Religion.

Such sentiments are entertained from an attentive observation of the practical salutary effects produced by the agency of moral, and religious societies, where they are maintained and cherished.

But it is triumphantly suggested that, "it would afford some satisfaction to know what good has been achieved by the religious institutions of those sections of the country that are eternally reviled."

One word as to the results. Instruction is extended to all classes and conditions of the people, the children of even the poorest citizen are taught the rudiments of education, and enabled thereby to read and understand the constitution and laws of their country.

By the schooner Mejicana arrived yesterday from Vera Cruz, we received papers from Jalapa up to the 27th ult, which also contain dates of the city of Mexico of the 17th.

Little as we thought the project of amnesty proposed by the Mexican government in favor of its exiled citizens, distinguished for liberality, would not appear to have been at all entertained by the congress.
