One of the most extensive bank robberies that has fallen to our lot to record, has taken place since the closing of the City Bank, on Saturday last.

The police Magistrate, with Mr. Hays have been through the building, and examined the premises, and we believe all are satisfied that the bank and vault were entered with false keys.

The other particulars will be found in the advertisement which follows. Among the property abstracted was a trunk belonging to the Messrs Allen, containing between thirteen and fourteen thousand dollars in bills of the country banks.

SPAIN. Extract of a letter, dated Madrid, Jan. 27.—"By order of the government, the carnival is not to be observed this year. Orders have been issued for the increase of the garrisons on the frontiers. About 30,000 men are to be levied, and the government have directed, that as they cannot afford more than 3000 dollars per month for each regiment (700 men), the residue is to be raised among the inhabitants of the provinces, at the discretion of the captains-general.
