THE GREEKS OF THAT ISLAND. Twenty-two villages had made their submission. There are now in the bay not cleared 5 ships 1 barque, 9 brigs, in all 15 vessels, of which 10 are British. At the wharves there is 1 ship 3 brigs, 2 schooners—whole number of vessels in port 21.
