Message of the President.

A discussion of considerable interest grew out of the message of the President, on Wednesday, on the subject of our commercial relations with Great Britain...

Mr. Everett, of Mass. supported, at some length, the motion for referring the message to the Committee on Foreign Affairs.

Mr. Cambreleng replied. He did not, he observed, wish to detain the committee on a mere question of reference, but he rose for the purpose of noticing a use which had been made by the gentleman from Massachusetts...

A letter of the 22d ult. from Odessa states that the consort of Jussuff Pacha had been to the Opera in that town.

Accounts from Constantinople to the 26th February state that the Porte has paid the second instalment of the indemnity stipulated in the treaty of Adrianople in favor of Russian commerce.

It is added that, in acknowledgment of this promptness, the Russian cabinet has remitted several thousand piastres.

The Berlin State Gazette of the 23d inst. gives the following intelligence from London:—"On the subject of Greece since the conference of the 4th of February, two others were held on the twentieth and twenty-sixth of the same month; at the first of these, we are informed the three powers entered into an engagement to guarantee the integrity of the New State.

The King of Prussia has sent a rescript to Field Marshal Count Diebitz, with the Insignia of the Order of the Black Eagle set in diamond.

It is generally reported that the protest entered by M. de Saint Priest, the French Ambassador at Madrid, against the late decree of the King of Spain, abolishing the Salic law, had not met the approbation of the French Cabinet.

Mr. A. BEAUVAIS will be supported by a great number of voters, at the next election, as Candidate for the place of Governor of the State of Louisiana.
