OF THE PARISH OF ST. BERNARD. Estate of Charlotte La Barr, wife of Antoine Blavena, senr. In conformity with a judgment of the Court of Probates, in and for the Parish of St. Bernard, under date of the 20th of September last, rendered in the suit of Antoine Blavena, senr. vs. Mrs. Thomas and others, will be offered to public sale by the undersigned judge of the same, on the premises, on Saturday the 5th of November next, at the hour of 10 o'clock, A. M. the following property, to-wit:

A SUGAR PLANTATION situated in the Parish of St. Bernard, about two leagues below the city of New Orleans, and on the same side of the river, measuring eighteen arpents fronting the Mississippi, with all its depth extending to the lake, diminishing in width at forty arpents from the river; three arpents at the lower limit, and bounded above by the plantation of St. Amant brothers, and below by that of the heirs of Laronde.

The following BUILDINGS are constructed on said plantation: A two story brick dwelling house, divided into sixteen rooms or apartments, surrounded by a spacious gallery. A brick sugar house, with two sets of kettles. A circular brick building, containing a Steam Engine, a Sugar mill, &c. And further, three Slaves, named Pogon, a creole negro woman, good house servant; Hyacinthe, her son, a poughman, and Fine, her daughter, house servant. The animals, instruments of Tillage, Carts, Tools, provisions, Carriages, house Furniture, and all other moveable effects generally whatever on the said plantation.
