The Mobile Commercial Register conveys a most agreeable piece of information. Mr. Porter, the mail contractor, has engaged the route between Orleans and Mobile, and secured the use of a new steam boat now building in Cincinnati.

Last Saturday's mail brought New-York papers of the 21st and Charleston of the 27th; by the British brig Verma, at the latter port, the Charleston Editors are furnished with London papers of the 10th and 11th of September and Liverpool of the 12th.

Of the political news of Europe the quantum is very sparing, and even that of a very unsatisfactory character. Paris journal of the 7th of August, and Berlin papers of the 2d contain very little of positive intelligence from Poland.

FRANCE—SEVEN DAYS LATER. Partial success of the Poles—Defeat of Rudiger's corps—Reported retrograde movement of Paskewitch—Capture of a Russian man-of-war by 300 Hydriots.

Ship OLYMPIA, captain Hammond, sailed from Havre on the 15th September, arrived here yesterday and brought our regular files of the Constitution, National, and Gallegani's Messenger of the 18th of September inclusive.

The late news received at Paris, through the German papers, on the situation of Warsaw and that of the Polish army are generally satisfactory.

It is evident from the extracts, which we offer our readers that the body of the troops, under the command of general Rudiger has been beaten, and prevented from forming a junction with the main body of the Russian army under the walls of Warsaw.

The Berlin State Gazette of the 6th instant announces that a serious disturbance took place at Steetin on the 1st. During the whole day the lower classes collected in large numbers, openly manifested their discontent at the precautionary measures adopted against the cholera, and broke the windows of several houses belonging to persons in authority.

A Secretary, attached to the French Embassy at St. Petersburg, arrived at Paris on Saturday with dispatches for the Minister for Foreign Affairs. BELGIUM.—The head-quarters of Marshal Gerard were expected on the 10th instant at Maubeuge, in the environs of which town there will be formed a camp of between 18,000 and 20,000 men.

Does this look like a corroboration of the news brought, at Bostoa from Cronstadt? The Constitutional contains a very remarkable description of the ravages made by the Cholera Morbus at Philadelphia. It rates the number of cases at 116 a week.

The same paper of the 13th mentions the total evacuation of Belgium by the French troops. Gen. Gerard has pitched his head quarters at Maubeuge, within a few hundred yards of the Belgic frontiers.

It is known to all the world, that Pera, the most beautiful faubourg of Constantinople, is almost entirely occupied by Franks and Greeks. As a proof of the deep rooted hostility of the Turks against the Christians, we glean this fact from the National.

PARIS, Sept 13th 2 o'clock, P. M. The Augsburg Gazette has the following, dated Leinberg, Aug. 26.—"An officer attached to the staff of Gen. Rosen writes to one of his friends that the garrison of Praga was about to make diversion on the right bank of the Vistula.

The Hamburg Correspondent contains the following, dated Berlin, Sept. 3.—"By intelligence just received from Thorn, it appears that the Russians have sustained a considerable defeat. A Russian courier had passed that town in great haste. It is asserted that the bridge near Szlyho (a town situated on the left bank of the Vistula, in Prussia) had been suddenly broken down by the Russians, and all their magazines removed to the left bank of the river.
