Our columns, today, are almost exclusively occupied with an article from the Globe, on the subject of the defeat of the bank coalition, in the national senate, by Col. Benton, in which the substance of the speech of that gentleman is reported. It will repay an attentive perusal. We have no room for comments, but will remark upon it hereafter.

The cholera continues to increase in New York. On the 21st, there were 191 new cases in private practice, with 61 deaths; and 120 new cases in the hospitals, with 43 deaths.
