

STATE OF LOUISIANA. ELEVENTH LEGISLATURE, SECOND SESSION. JOURNAL OF THE SENATE.

TUESDAY, 7th January 1834. The Senate met agreeably to adjournment. Members present: Messrs. Chas. Derbigny, president; Burthe, Dupré, La Branche, LeBlanc, Moore, Nicholas, Prudhomme, Sloan and Weatherbee.

Mr. Burthe, chairman of the committee of enrollment, reported as duly enrolled the bill from the House, entitled: "An act to authorize certain judges to grant marriage licenses in certain cases." Whereupon the president signed the same and it was taken back to the House.

Mr. Sloan, chairman of the joint committee appointed to visit and report upon the condition of the penitentiary now building in Baton Rouge presented the following reports.

The select joint committee appointed by the Legislature to visit and examine the penitentiary now erecting in the town of Baton Rouge Respectfully report, that they have discharged their duty.

The result of their examination is of the satisfactory character. The committee were under the impression that the principal object of their appointment was to examine the materials and the workmanship of the building, and consequently have confined themselves almost exclusively to those points; and it affords them great satisfaction to say that all the materials which were to be seen, consisting of brick, lime, sand, timber, and slate, were of the best quality.

Friday, 10th January 1834. The Senate met agreeably to adjournment. Members present: Messrs. Charles Derbigny president; Beauvais, Burthe, Dupré, Labranche, LeBlanc, Moore, Nicholas, Prudhomme, Sloan, Tenney and Weatherbee.

Two written messages from the Governor were received, brought by Mr. Verloin Degruys, his private secretary.

A letter was read, addressed to the president, and signed by R. L. Booker, cashier of the Bank of Louisiana, enclosing a printed copy of several resolutions adopted by the board of directors of said bank, relative to that part of the Governor's message respecting the funds of the State in said bank, which were also read in English, ordered to be translated; and read in French message next.

A verbal message from the Governor, by Mr. Verloin Degruys, his private secretary, informed the Senate, that the Governor had approved and signed the: "Resolution directing the civil engineer to make an examination of Lake Bestineau and Bayou Dorchéat."

Mr. Burthe gave notice that he would introduce a bill entitled: "An Act to amend the act incorporating the Carroll Road Company."

Mr. Beauvais, on the part of the Committee of unfinished business, introduced a "resolution requiring the civil engineer to survey the Bayou LaLaurie." Rules dispensed with and read for the first, second and third readings, and taken to the House.

A message from the House of Representatives by Mr. Pitot, their clerk, informed the Senate that the committee of enrollment of the house had reported as duly enrolled, the bill entitled: "An Act to repeal the several acts relative to vaccine matter," and that the speaker had signed the same.

The same message requested the concurrence of the Senate in the bills and resolution entitled: "An Act to authorize and require the police jury of the Parish of Concordia to lay off three additional police jury wards in said parish." Read for the first time.

"An Act to amend an act entitled: "An Act to incorporate the Orleans Canal Press Company." Rules dispensed with and read for the first and second times.

On motion, for the adoption of the section as follows: That no person who is not a citizen of the State of Louisiana shall be a stockholder in said company until the expiration of three years from the passage thereof, and no transfer of the stock of said company to persons other than citizens of the State of Louisiana during the space aforesaid shall be valid or binding.

Mr. Burthe, called for the yeas and nays, which produced the following result: For the adoption, Messrs. Burthe, Beauvais, Labranche, LeBlanc and Dupré. Against it: Moore, Nicholas, Prudhomme, Sloan and Tenney.

There being a tie, the president voted in favour of it, and it was consequently adopted. Resolution providing for the election of a state printer for 1834. Rules dispensed with, read for first and second times, and amended.
