THE LINCH FIGHERY.

The last number of the Haster Medical Surgical Journal operating a letter of a Franch, Physician, published, in the Gazettedge Houstans, descriptive of the Leech Fishery, in a province of France. It is adjected to the term "Whale Pichery," that the monarch of the Bespiesout a field. What would Dr. Hutch all say of Leeches? The account, however, is interesting and we give it to our readers.

The country about La Brepus is persona the most unit-teresting in France. The people are misurable leeking, the cattle wretched, the fish just as bed—but the leeches are admirable.

If you ever pass through La Rienne, you will size a mannal and straight haired with a woollen cap on his least, and his legs and arms naked—be wake along the borders of a marsh, among the spots left dry by the surrounding waters; but particularly wherever the vegetation seems to preserve the subjectent soil undisturbed: this man is a leech-fisher.—To see him from a distance—his wo-begone aspect—his bullow eyes—his livid lips—hid singular gestures—you would take him for a patient who had left his sick bed in a fit of delirium. If you observe him every now and then raising his legs, and examining them one after the other, you might suppose him a fool; but his is an intelligent leach-fisher.—The leaches attach themselves to his legs and feet as he moves among their haunts; he feels their presence from their bite, and gathers them as they cluster about the roots of the bull rushes of spa-weeds or beneath the stones awerded with green and gluey moss. Since repose on the mudwhile others swim about—but so slowly, that they are easily gathered with the hand. In a layorable season, it is possible, in the course of three or four house, to store 10 or 12 dozen of them in the little bag which the gathere carries on his shoulders. Some of them have little rafts to go baards, 3000 feet mech baards; 24,000 feet scanting; 3000 opon; these rafts are made of twigs and molies, and it is no may matter to propel them among the wer is and aquatic plants. At this reason, too, the supply in the pools is scanty; the fisher can only take the few that swim within his reach, or those that got entangled in the structure of the

raft.
It is a borrid trade, in whatever way it is carried on.-The leech gatherer is constantly more or less in the water or cathing fog and mist, and fetel odors from the marsh, he s often attacked with ague, catarrha and theumatism -Some indulge in strong liquors, to keep off the noxious in-fluence, but they pay for it in the end by disorders of other kinds. But with all its forbidding peculiarities, the leechfishery gives employment to many hands; if it be perfucious, it is also lucrative. Besides supplying all the neighboring pharmaciens, great quantities are experted, and there are regular traders engaged for the purpose.
