Yesterday's mail furnishes no news of any moment. No New York papers later than the 11th instant came to hand. We learn, however, from a slip forwarded to the office of the Baltimore "Advertiser," under date of Sunday, 14th of July, that no disturbances had occurred in York on the night of the 12th. Sixty patriots, detached from the military and civil authorities were on duty during the night; but there was no assembly of lawless persons.

The deep respect which the people bear to the memory of George Washington, was strikingly evinced during the last day in the city of New York. While the mob were carrying on their work of destruction at the house of Dr. L. Tapia, they were checked in their career of devastation by the discovery that they were about committing to the flames the houses of Washington. One voice made up of a thousand voices, shoudl have been raised in Washington! in God's name do not burn Washington! The picture was born off in triumph and safely deposited in a neighboring house.

The Commercial Intelligencer, of the city of Philadelphia, having republished from the bold Aurora, an article shamefully abusive of the character of our country's father, and attributed to the pen of William Diana, the veteran of the American press has addressed a letter to the editor, charging him with avariciousness. The article alluded to, is, we believe, one which appeared at the period of Washington's demise. Mr. Diana asserts that he was not in this country at the time, and that he was not connected with the Aurora until two years after.

The Ohio Canals.—There has been an unprecedented increase of business on the Ohio Canals during the present season. In the month of May last, the tonnage were \$26,231; for the month of May of last year they did not amount to much more than \$15,000; making an increase in favor of this year, of something more than sixty per cent. And yet Senator Ewing, in a dispatch of malapropism clearest, said that "the canal was a solitude," *ceterum cuncte appula.*

PUBLIC MEETING.

A meeting of the citizens of New Orleans was convened according to public notice, at Hewlett's Exchange on the evening of the 25th instant, to take into consideration the case of the British subject, Captain S. J. Dales, who was called to the bar, and Gladys Banks and A. Quarter, appointed executors. The object of the meeting being explained by the chairman upon motion it was resolved that three persons be appointed to prepare resolutions for the consideration of the government, with regard to Jacob Wilson. The Vice and Standard, and Standard of the British Consul, by the chairman, who reported the following preamble and resolution, with both the amendments proposed by Messrs. R. Hunt and A. Quarter, were adopted:

ARTICLE I.
Orders will immediately be dispatched to all the commandants of places and of forces in the field, and to all the authorities which still recognize the government of Don Miguel, instructing the aforesaid to submit themselves to the government of Dona Maria, under the above mentioned stipulations.

ARTICLE II.
The provisions of the above article shall extend to all ecclesiastical, civil, and military authorities, in the dominions of the monarchy, beyond the seas.

ARTICLE III.
All regiments and bodies of troops, now in the service of the usurper, or of delivering up their arms, horses, and ammunition, shall peacefully disband and return to their homes under the penalty of forfeiting the benefit of this amnesty.

The commander-in-chief of the forces at Entra, after agreeing the above terms in the name of all persons concerned, agreed in order to carry them into execution, on the following supplement (articles):

ARTICLE I.

Orders will immediately be dispatched to all the commandants of places and of forces in the field, and to all the authorities which still recognize the government of Don Miguel,

instructing the aforesaid to submit themselves to the government of Dona Maria, under the above mentioned stipulations.

ARTICLE II.

The provisions of the above article shall extend to all ecclesiastical, civil, and military authorities, in the dominions of the monarchy, beyond the seas.

ARTICLE III.

Don Miguel shall leave the city of Entra on the 30th of May; his troops now stationed in that city, and quartered in the seminary, shall be divided into different bodies, and under the immediate responsibilities of their respective officers, and marched to the places appointed below, and immediately as they shall have reached their several places of destination, they will be furnished with safe conduct to their homes.

CADIZ, June 8.
