We attended the meeting convened last evening at Bank's arcade, and were pleased to find that few seemed disposed to take part in the proceedings, except those immediately interested by being disappointed in arrogant or fanciful expectations. An hour and a half elapsed after the time appointed for the meeting; before a person could be prevailed on to take the chair. Then as a fathers hope, Mr. Christy had that greatness thrust on him. But as time was to press, that he commenced before secretaries were appointed, or the meeting was organized. When this occurred, a preamble and string of resolutions were read, concerning the governor; and when put to the vote, there seemed almost as many nay votes as yes, but the chairman being a jurist (!) and the jury, decided against the nays.

We shall reserve our comments on this meeting till next number.

We are glad that even the enemies of Governor White are compelled to give him credit for almost the only executive act, which he has done without the concurrence and approbation of the senate—that of having vetoed the bill imposing a tax on travellers. We would have heaped him highly had he vetoed one half the banks that have been established during the session; as it is we are pleased; and perhaps may feel proud; for the it attracted public attention to the invidiousness of the act.

There are many instances in which we have been especially useful in making suggestions. For instance (with all due modesty be it spoken) two bills had been introduced to suppress gambling and hazards—one by Mr. L. H. Moore; and the other by Mr. Z. Labarre. We pointed out the defects of both bills. General Isaac Thomas was good enough to consider our suggestions; and immediately drew a bill in conformity to the same, which Mr. Moore presented; and which has become a law. We might cite other instances to the same effect, did we choose to appear egotistical; but we will not.

We have endeavored to do the "state service" and have not failed. Being a stranger we have not actually relied on the justice of our cause and the strength of our arguments, whether to produce conviction, or induce persuasion.

The public welfare shall ever be our guide; and although Governor White has not been elected by the party with whom we were immediately connected, such part of his executive career as merit approbation will cheerfully be vindicated. He is now to act for the people; for a party. He should act for all citizens; and prefer those best known and most meritorious—of whatever class or color. The needy or impotent applicant being a native citizen, should not therefore be preferred to a more competent and deserving, being only a naturalized citizen.

Mr. Rice, the unrivaled Jim Crow, will give a benefit night on Monday next. You don't say so? Oh, yes, then and see.

Mr. Charles Derbigny resigned his seat as president of the senate on the last day of the session; when Mr. Dupree was chosen his successor. It is believed that Mr. Derbigny will shortly resign also as senator.
