Section 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the State of Louisiana, in this behalf assembled, that the provisions of the act passed on the 14th of May, 1834, in relation to the sale of the lands of the late John P. H. de la Salle, be amended in and to the effect following.

Section 2. Be it further enacted, That any one who shall have caused to be made any improvement on the lands of the late John P. H. de la Salle, without the consent and express permission of the latter, during the time allowed him by the exclusive privilege, shall pay a fine of one hundred dollars, for each acre of land so improved.
