By the eastern post of yesterday we received papers from New York and Philadelphia. There had been three arrivals from Europe—one from Rochelle of the 16th June, one from Havre of the 11th, and one from London of the 10th. The Marconi that started here on Sunday last brought dates from Havre of the 12th.

The principal information is that the American indemnification bill had passed unchanged in the chamber of peers by a very great majority—and that Great Britain had decided on intervention in favor of the queen of Spain. France had resolved on nothing definitive; and it is likely that should she make any exertion, it will be merely to send troops to the Pyrenees. An intervention seems now essential, not only to vindicate the quadruple alliance treaty; but because the Carlists are getting the ascendancy, and are secretly aided by Austria and Russia.

We have not received further intelligence from France. The ministry were divided on the Spanish question; but some measures had been taken of a decided character in sending troops to Savoyon, and ships seaward of Spain, to wait further orders.

The intelligence from England is chiefly confined to the temporary depressed state of the cotton market in Liverpool; and the money market in London. The latter is in consequence of the anxiety relative to Spanish bonds; and although money is not scarce, and the English funds gain a firm demand, other stocks are not readily purchased. There had eleven sales, of a London bank. The funds in Paris had advanced in price and increased in demand on the 11th ult.

The British parliament was occupied chiefly in desultory conversations relative to Spain. A bill to secure the voting of a tax had been lost in the house of commons, by the vote of the moderate Whigs with the conservatives against the radicals. But a useful bill for effecting a mutual reform in the different corporations throughout England had been read a first time, with success under the auspices of Lord John Russell. Lord Brougham had introduced a bill to promote national education, by primary and normal schools.
