Circular—The government has received information that, inshe United States so North America, meetings are called for the avowed purpose of getting up and 2 ong out expeditions against the Republic of Mexico, in order to send assistance to the rebols, loser the civil war, and inflict upon our country all the calamities by which it is followed. In the United States, our ascient ally expeditions are now organized similar to that headed by the traitor Jose Antonio Mijia, and some have even set out for Texas. They have been furnished with every kind of ammunition, by means of which the revolted colonists are enabled to resist and fight the ration from which they never have received but immense benefits. The government is also positively informed that these acts, condemned by the wisdem of the laws of the United States, are also reported by the general government, with which the best intelligence and the greatest harmony still prevail. However, as these adventurers and speculators have succeeded in escaping the penal ties inflicted by the laws of their own country, it becomes necessary to judgot measures for their punishment. His excellency the president ad interim, anx ions to repress these aggressions which constitute noonly an officace to the sovereignty of the Mexican nat tion, but also to an evident violation of international laws as they are generally adopted, has ordered the following decrees to be enforced.

1st. Foreigners landing our country, will be deemed pirates and dealt with as such, being citizens of no nation presently at war with the republic, and fighting under no recognised flag.

2nd. All foreigners who will import either by sea evant and, in the places occupied by the rebels, either arms w ammunition of any kind for the use of them will be deemed pirates and punished as such.
