in 1830 the whole number of blacks, bond and free, in the United States, was \$,228,641. Out of this number \$0.13 were retained as of one hundred years and upwards. At the same period the critice white population was 10.537,378, out of which only 539 had attained a century and spwards. Attaking every allowance for want of proper registering, these results show an estonishing difference in the comparative longevity of whites and blacks. The number of deaf and dumb negroes is proportionably small to that of the whites, while the number of blind is much greater in comparison.—N Y Jour. Com.
