Not the least important of these was an appropria-tion of the land from the basin of the canal Carondelet, by Basin and Canal streets to the river—with the right to open an uninterrupted communication from the Mississippi to lake Pontchartrain. The delay in effecting that junction has been absolute defeat. The company has still the property and power; but what use can they now make of either, in consequence of the increase of population, and the absurd ideas enter-tained by many that a canel in that place would geo graphically separate the contiguous municipalities? Canals intersect many towns in Europe, with the hap piest effect, without producing the apprehended evils; and were proper bridges thrown across one that might be constructed in Canal street, no evil-could result to consumers in Canal series, no evi-could result to continue intercommunication on either side of that inter course. Such bridges could easily be placed opposite er-very second street, or perhaps every street parallel to the river, without producing inconvenience to the boats trading on it; or evil results to the drays, carts or
