Mr. Mont, of the Committee to whom was referred the bill for the voluntary liquidation of the Union Bank began his report by stating that the bill was introduced on March 14, 1934, and has since that time been the subject of much discussion.

When in 1934, it was found that many of the Banks of the State were insolvent and that the interest of the State and of the public required that the solvent Banks should be separated from the insolvent, and that the latter should be liquidated in a course of final settlement, it was found that a "voluntary liquidation of Banks" bill, introduced by Mr. Mont, was necessary.

For the liquidation of these Banks, however, for which the State had issued Bonds, as there were two parties interested not known in the others (that is the State and the Bondholders) it was necessary to provide in a different manner. The three Sections 28, 29 and 30 of the first bill were found to be inadequate and imperfect, and one of the first and most important subjects that received the attention of the Legislature was the subject of the amendments recommended by the Governor in his last message, and now under consideration of the House or some of its Committees, will, it is believed, fully and satisfactorily accomplish the object it was designed.

It is now understood by the Committee, that it is the wish of the Stockholders and Directors of the Union Bank of Louisiana, for which the State has issued \$7,000,000 of Bonds, to go into liquidation in a different manner as contemplated by the bill referred to. The Committee, therefore, has the honor to report to the Senate the bill which it has prepared, and which it is believed will be approved by the Senate.
