The first striking fact disclosed by these statistics is the immease and steady increase in immigration. The number of those who arrived at New York by sea during the month of June, 1849, was 29078, being an increase of 6,031 over the number arriving in June, 1848. The number who arrived in July was 30,098, being an increase over July, 1848, of 5,476.—
