The NICARAGUA TREATY.—There is now no doubt whatever that a Treaty
with Sir Henry Bulwer, for the peaceful
and friendly adjustment of the Nicaragua dis-
pute, has been negotiated and signed by the
high contracting parties, and is awaiting
ratification. It appears to be equally certain
that this Treaty will obtain the sanction of an
impressive majority of the Senate. It is pro-
posed to be a writer for the *Courier* and *Enquirer*,
in which the United States will, in the advanced
stage, be called upon to ratify it.
