At the present time, the number of electors being reduced to 7,000,000, to require 2,000,000 to 10 in oinvert the proportion—that is to say, it is to demand almost one-third instead of one-fifth, and thus, in a certain eventuality, to take the election out of the hands of the people to give it to the Assembly.
