NEWS FROM MEXICO.

The French Enter the City of Mexico
Triumphantly, and are Exultingly Received by the Population.

Gen. Porfirio's Proclamation—Varies

Particulars.

The Despatch de Mexico of the 10th of June,
which has been kindly furnished to us, contains
very interesting particulars on the entrance of
the French Army into the capital of
Mexico. The news was brought to Santiago
de Cuba by the steamer Vera Cruz.

The French army entered the city of Mexico
on the 3d of June, without having met with the
least resistance. President Juarez, his minis-
ters and the other members of the Government
had fled to the city of Léon.

These prisoners were all recently captured at
Fevered, 9 o'clock A.M. on the 1st of June, by
General Serrano, who had been sent to capture
Rancho de la Guadalupe, and who had
captured the commandant of the town, Gen.
WILLIAM H. SEWARD.

From Fortress Morris.

Forces, Monday, June 27.—The
steamship Monitor left for City Point this
afternoon, with 600 rebel prisoners, in
charge of Major John E. Mullford, and
the rest of the Cabinet, who were invited to
be present at the celebration of the
Fourth of July:

Department of War,
Washington, June 27, 1863.

General.—You are right. Continue the
celebration of Independence in Boston. Keep
the sacred fire alive in Faneuil Hall. Though
it may seem to go against the spirit of the
nation, yet leave there and everywhere else throughout the land. Seemingly
dependence—dependence fire on fasten at
the spirit of humanity which has ever char-
acterized our nation. It does not deserve to involve the innocent
with the same punishment of the guilty. Had
I applied the torch without regard to time or
place, I would have done my duty, but I do not
think that would have been fully vindicated as an act of
just retaliation for the unparalleled acts of brat-
taly perpetrated by our own countrymen.

The rebels do not stop, and we must follow
them.

No more will be acknowledged, and
if any are given by their officers or men, they
will be held in contempt, and the place where
they are received will be exposed to the gaze of
our forces.
