New York, Aug. 13.—Iron clad will rendezvous in Clark Channel, Delaware River.

Another city bank teller has absconded with \$10,000.

New York, Aug. 21.—The freed slaves were finally accorded here to-day: several were family.

The contract for carrying the mail between Galveston and New Orleans has been awarded to the Atlantic and Mississippi Steamship Company.

The Government has ordered the remittance of seized property now held by the Freedmen's Bureau, and a sum is to be paid on collection by the blacks of compensation for labor on stand-to-sops.

The military investigation into the conduct of Gen. Hatch is progressing at Charleston. Gen. Gillmore says the military will retain control of the State of South Carolina until civil government is restored.

New York, Aug. 21.—The British, from Liverpool the 11th has arrived. Cotton unchanged. Sale of the week \$500,000 bales. Mid-May Broadcloth prices advanced.

Jackson, Aug. 21.—The following Constitutional amendment is to pass the Convention:

The institution of slavery having been destroyed in the State of Mississippi, neither negro nor involuntary servitude, otherwise than the punishment of crimes, whereof the party shall have been duly convicted, shall ever exist in the State; and the Legislature shall have power to prohibit, by law, the importation of slaves, but shall provide by law for the protection and security of the persons and property of the freedom of the State and guard them and the State against any evils that may arise from their sudden emanation."

This is substantially the position taken by the *New Orleans Bee*, Mr. E. M. Foster, printer to the *Advertiser*.

A costly contemporary, referring to the country's war with France on account of Mexico, says:

We believe that such a war would do more to cement and perpetuate friendship between the two countries than all the means now used to reconstruct, and extend the blessings of peace and good government over the Southern States.

This is not the first expression of the same idea in the South since the close of the late war. To give it even theoretical validity, it is necessary to assume the certainty of several conditions, probably highly improbable.

It supposes that the South can, without the due care one another can become shears and staves friends by agreeing to make a common quarrel with a third, and that the South and the North will be drawn in cordial unity together in a war waged by the Government against a foreign power, and especially against France. Let us examine this again.

It is quite true that a common enemy can be a bond of union and produce kind of friendship between those who may be otherwise indifferent to one another. But, the other hand, it is almost a moral impossibility for those who are already enemies to each other to unite as equal parties to one another.

As a general rule, however, independent communities, and those who are already good friends, will be disposed to quarrel for independence's sake with others.

What is to reverse the operation of this principle in respect of the "discontented elements" of the United States? It is not shown how or why the proposed coalition could be formed, and in what way the "blended of peace" is to be obtained by embarking in a war of insurrectional duration, or how the cause of "good government," in the sense of a military civil administration, as so much intended by the writer, from whom the phrase is quoted, is to be advanced by persons immediately circumstanced. The are calculated to paralyze all regular civil authority and widen the domain of irresponsible military power.

Even admitting that in a foreign war of aggression the "discontented elements" might be united, it would be for the conquerors only. The prospect certainly looks that promises to remove the cause of discord, nothing that could be expected to do so, and nothing that could be expected to do so, but that the South, in a more virtuous form than ever, will be a more virtuous form than ever.
