New Customs Collector at Port Townsend Returns to Former Rule. F. D. He has refused admittance to seven Chinese who arrived se Port Townsend, Wash., from Vicsoria, B. C., on the ground that they had departed from other ports when seaving this country. Until 15 months ago the requirement was enforced that Ohinese must reenter at the port of departure, but during the past year compliance with this rule has not been sequired from Chinese immigrants, owing to a precedent established by treasury department in the case of the Strathnevis immigrants, when Chinese were admitted regardless of the port of departure. A BIG FALLING OFF:

Set Many Will Take the Fall Civil Service Examination.

The regular fall civil service examinabions throughout the country for all places of government offices will muster only about a quarter or a third of the usual number of candidates. This is the prediction made by the civil serpice commission, and Chief Examiner Berven attributes this falling off to the unusual number of applicants exserined during the spring, when a highwater mark was reached, the number of applicants examined then being an ingrease of 100 per cent. over the preceding fall on spring. This rush was due to the change of administration and the civil service extension made by Presiment Cleveland. As a result, and in view of an inadequate examining force the commission is far in arrears in marking the papers, and 14,000 of them, all submitted during the spring examinations, have yet to be reached for marking. This aggregate includes 2,255 relating to the railway mail service and and 1,451 to the clerk-copyist places. This unprecedented arrearage has been a great factor in deterring applicants from applying for examination at this

POWERFUL SERMON IN A PRISON | PRIZE FIGHTS FOR MISSOURL Candemned Felon Causes Convicts

Fulton county (Ga.) jail was the other morning the scene of as odd an occurrence as has ever happened within its walls. Horace S. Perry, the condemned murderer of Lanier, who has just been hanged for his crime, led religious services in the prison chapel in such an impressive and solemn manner that the large congregation of felons and outlaws grew violently hysterical under his power.

Rev. R. S. Stevenson, who has conducted the Sunday services at the laft. yielded to Perry at the prisoner's urgent request. Perry's text was taken. from Acta 16: "Believe in the Lord Jesus Christ and thou shalt be saved." Hesaid that as the hours of his life were fast shortening he felt it a duty to use them in an effort to save other souls.

He pleaded earnestly with the convicts surrounding him that they would mend their ways and lead a religious life whether they spent them in confinement or were released.

During his powerful exhortation the prisoners moaned and wept and moaned, but when he referred to the desperate state in which he, his widow and children would be thrown upon his death, the audience became almost insane with emotion. So potent was his spell over them that Perry, to break the

Taylor Delk, the notorious outlaw. himself under death sentence, and whose son Tom was hanged two months ago, led the singing, and at the close the audience filed slowly out, stopping to shake hands with Perry.

WILL SHIP TO SUPERIOR S

Alleged Change Which May Some what Affect Chicago's Commerce. There is to be a change in the methods of handling the corn crop this year unless all indications fail, and it will deprive Chicago of the benefits accruing from millions of bushels of this cereal going through that port. It is the intention of some of the biggest operators to divert the corn crop to Superior and the head of the lakes this fall.

The prime factor in this movement is F. H. Peavey, of Minnespolis, and his associates. They have been enabled to make the alteration through the changing of the basis of rail rates to the lake ports.

The Omaha has been the chief factor in this. Last winter it put out a new tariff sheet, which adjusted rates and left it so that there was no longer a discrimination in favor of Chicago. Although a longer haul than to Superior, Chicago had the lowest rate, and there was no choice but for elevator companies to send corn that way for Buffalo. The rate to southwestern corn points is now 17 cents and 19 cents for 100 pounds, a reduction of several cents, while the same points to Chicago have to pay 18 cents to 23 cents, a decided dif-

The agents of the Pesvey interests. the Globe and Belt line elevators in this city and elsewhere throughout the country, are now in the open market taking all the corn that is offered. They ere paying the Chicago price and shipping it on through Superior, Wis.

"Resolved, That the American bachelor politician shirks his duty to the human family when he fails to provide a home for some good woman before he engages in the profession of politics; therefore he is not to be trusted after be has entered the political arens, in which temptations surround him on all sides, and that, unfortunately, modern society has heretofore given the political bachelor too much latitude by ignoring his private life.

"Resolved, That as far as practicable a list of bachelor politicians who are aspirants for public office be obtained in the states of Massachusetts and New York, and formal protests be sent out against their election or reelection by the Women's Rescue league, on the ground that they are ineligible to hold public office."

The league extends its congratulations to ex-Mayor Edwin Upton Curtis, of Boston, on his approaching marriage, and recommends for him a two years' vacation from politics, in which to enjoy his honeymoon.
