PUTS AIR INTO LIQUID.

Prof. Peckham, a Brooklyn Scientist, Makes Experiments.

Freezes Mercury Hard Enough to Drive a Nail—Unique Test Whereby Fire is Apparently Frozen in Red-Hot Stove.

Prof. W. C. Peckham gave a public exhibition of the other day at the Adelphi college, Brooklyn, of the phenomena of liquid air.

The first scientists to liquefy oxygen did so at a cost of \$2,500 a quart. Charles E. Tripler had recently discovered a method, the professor said, to produce it at a nominal cost with a 40 horse-power engine.

In his experiments the professor took a handful of fluid mercury and placed it in a kind of mold. This was poured into a pot of liquid air, and before it became hard a stick of iron was inserted in the mercury.

The kettle was then placed on a coal fire, and the violence of the boiling began to increase. The professor poured a tumblerful of water into the kettle and in three minutes, although the kettle was over a red-hot stove, took out the water in the shape of a large piece of ice.

OLD MONITORS RESURRECTED. Eight of the fighters are hauled out of the mud at League Island.

The old single turret monitors of the rebellion were pulled out of their bed of mud in the back channel at League Island at Philadelphia, the other day.

VICTIMS OF INDIANS.

Skeletons of Young Taylor and His Bride Exhumed from a Well.

From Wewoka, the town in the Seminole nation near which the awful tragedy was enacted in which three Indians were burned at the stake by an excited mob of whites to avenge the death of a white woman who had been brutally murdered by Indians, comes the story of the discovery of evidences of another tragedy which took place in that locality many years ago.

While digging a well on a large ranch of which Henry Jackson is overseer workmen found two skeletons which had evidently been buried there years before. The bones crumbled soon after being exposed, but in the sand in which they were buried were found some trinkets which offered a key to one of the hitherto unfathomed mysteries of the western frontier.

Shortly after the close of the civil war a descendant of Gen. Zachary Taylor fell desperately in love with a beautiful young woman of St. Louis named Octavia Malcolm, whose family, though eminently respectable, were only in moderate circumstances.

But Taylor was a self-reliant young man, and, taking his bride with him, he started from St. Louis for Fort Smith, Ark. They were never heard from again.

The finding of the two skeletons seems to afford convincing proof that the couple were killed by the Indians, for the medals, rings and locket bear mute testimony that the skeletons recently unearthed were those of Taylor and his young wife.
