

VICTORIOUS CUBANS.

Forces Under Gen. Garcia Now Occupy Town of Bayama.

Lieut. Rowan, United States Officer, Returns and Tells How He Found This Part of the Insurgent Army Situated.

A dispatch to the New York World from Key West says: The story of the occupation of Bayama by the victorious Cubans was brought to Key West by Lieut. A. S. Rowan.

"We had expected to find Garcia encamped somewhere in the fields or mountains," said the lieutenant. "Spanish fortifications were seen, but his headquarters were in Bayama. That I had always regarded as one of the strongest Spanish fortified towns. But such was the case. "Bayama had been in a state of partial siege for months. Garcia simply worried the Spaniards out on April 24. White flags were hoisted over every Spanish fort around Bayama. Gen. Garcia was correct in his supposition that the Spaniards did not intend to armistice, but simply hoisted a flag of truce to cover some treacherous military maneuver.

"That maneuver was the evacuation of Bayama. "The Cubans answered the flag of truce with heavy artillery and rifle fire. The Spaniards retreated in two columns to a little town called Embarcadero, on the Cauto river.

"For a distance of 200 yards on the San Augustine road the Cubans planted dynamite torpedoes that were exploded by an electric wire from the underbrush. "From that time on, Garcia's army continued Lieut. Rowan. "I believe that three entire companies of Spaniards and three pieces of artillery were literally blown to pieces.

RUINOUS RATE OF EXCHANGE.

Pierre Loti, the Frenchman, Returns to Paris from Spain and Talks of the War with United States.

A dispatch to the New York Herald from Paris says: Pierre Loti, who has just returned from Spain, speaking of the result of the present war, said: "You ask whether this war will have any effect upon the commercial and general interests of this part of Europe. Undoubtedly, but I do not go so far as to say it will have a ruinous effect. For the last two years the rate of exchange between France and Spain has been enormous. It has been for some time hovering between 40 and 50 per cent, and now just look at it—114 and over that. It is horrible and sad when you think of it. Such ruinous depreciation is disaster which penetrates far and wide, not only in Spain, but in France. In the counting houses of Europe and in the family circle it means deprivation of pleasure, as well as reduced material comfort. It spells poverty for a great many and forced economy for all, to a greater or less degree, in Europe.

"You ask if I think it likely there will be an alliance between England and America. I certainly think it most likely, but I do not for one moment believe Europe will tolerate any participation on the part of England in the fruits of America's victories in the Philippines.

BOATS OF MARVELOUS SPEED.

Russia Orders Two Torpedo Vessels Which Are to Make 38 Knots.

The Russian government has ordered of a British firm two 38-knot torpedo boats of the model of the Turbinia, and propelled with turbine motors working on four shafts, each of which carries three propellers. This is eight knots faster than the fastest torpedo boat destroyers in the British navy. Just how much courage is required on the part of the naval architect who signs his name to a contract for a 38-knot boat—38 knots is 44 miles an hour—as evident from a comparison of figures, says the Scientific American.

MAY BE RICH IN GOLD.

Senator Teller Receives a Letter Indicating That There Are Valuable Deposits in the Philippines.

Senator Teller has received a letter from a constituent in Colorado indicating that the Philippine islands may be found to be very rich in gold deposits. The writer says in 1875 he traveled from Manila to Singapore with a man who had gone from Montana to the island of Luzon for the purpose of investigating the reports of such wealth, who gave him this information in confidence and as a return for kindness rendered him by the senator's correspondent. "He told me," says the correspondent, "that the results of his investigation were far ahead of anything he had anticipated, and that the wealth of gold in that country was beyond estimating. He had gone to the Philippines with the intention of going into mining. When he found they were he went to the Spanish governor to secure permission, but this official would permit nothing of the kind. He gave me as the reason for his opposition that the development of the mines would tend to enrich and disturb the native population, while the Spanish policy was to keep them in ignorance and subjection."

SURVIVES A SNOWSLIDE.

Klondiker Rescues Lima O. and Tells of His Chicago Partner's Death.

Fred Rost, of Lima, O., returned the other night from Klondike in a serious condition, the result of being buried in a snowslide with 20 other miners, several of whom were killed. Rost left last fall and reached Pilella river in March. His partners were Arthur and Joseph LaLadune, of Chicago. They staked several claims and have found a large deposit. Being out of wood, they went to a mountain and were cutting timber when an avalanche swept upon them, burying them and 17 other miners who had claims near them, but whose names Rost did not know.

REBUKE TO FRANCE.

American Women to Boycott All Goods from That Country.

Promoters of the Patriotic League Are Enthusiastic and Determined—Take Up Fight in Earnest.

One of the most enthusiastic promoters of the American Women's Patriotic league, whose members are to pledge themselves to refrain from buying goods imported from France in retaliation for the attitude of the French people toward America in the present crisis, is the wife of Senator Chandler, of New Hampshire.

"American women," said Mrs. Chandler, "have come to the conclusion that France must be taught a lesson. She has vociferously proclaimed friendship and admiration for her sister republic, but at a time when her friendship would mean something to us she is holding off and avowing her friendship for Spain. We will show her that while a loss may come to her investments in Spain through this war there may be a greater loss impending from the loss of American trade and commerce. When I sign the pledge I shall conscientiously carry it out."

Mrs. William Tisdell, a prominent society leader of Washington, who has been selected as one of the organizers of the league, said: "I proclaim France the enemy of America and the ally of the United States. I will faithfully work to administer such a dose of retributive justice that the thrifty burghers that compose the French manufacturing class will not be likely to forget it."

Mrs. Albert Clifford Barney, the artist, said: "The pledge should be made active against future importations. If it is put into effect at once it will hurt our own merchants who are carrying large stocks of French goods. Nevertheless, so far as possible, I will deny myself all indulgence in French importations."

Mrs. Russell A. Alger, Mrs. Lyman Gage and Mrs. Justice McKenna have signified their intention to sign the pledge when it is formulated.
