

JONES GETS OUT ALIVE

Famous Hunter Returns from the Arctic Circle, But Fails to Bring Out Any Musk Oxen.

SILK MANUFACTURES.

Figures Which Show the Phenomenal Increase Since 1860—Imports Greatly Increased.

Silk manufactures in the United States, which in 1860 amounted to \$6,607,771 in value, doubled in the following decade, being, according to the figures of the census of 1870, \$12,210,662; more than trebled in the next decade, being, in 1880, \$41,033,045, and again doubled from 1880 to 1890, being in the latter year \$87,298,454, while a recent compilation by the secretary of the American Silk association shows that since 1890 the rate of increase has accelerated, making it probable that the silk production of the United States to-day amounts to nearly or quite \$150,000,000 per annum in value.

Imports of raw silk, which in the fiscal year 1897 were 6,513,612 pounds, were in 1898 10,315,161 pounds, and the total value of raw silk imported in 1898 was \$31,448,800, against \$18,915,283 in the preceding year.

SUBSTITUTE FOR RUBBER.

SAVED BY TEA COMMISSION.
