A NEW QUARTERLY.

To Be Published by Lady Churchill at Five Dollars a Copy.

Will Be Anglo-Saxon in Contents as Well as in Name—Famed Writers of Both Continents Are to Contribute.

"It will be Anglo-Saxon in name as well in contents." In these words that every popular Anglo-Saxon, Lady Randolph Churchill, broadly outlined the policy of the new quarterly miscellany which will appear in June simultaneously in London and New York.

Lady Randolph appeared very businesslike indeed as she sat at her desk in the library of her home in Great Cumberland place. The room was lined with books from floor to ceiling, and on her desk was a great mass of accumulated correspondence.

"Yes," said Lady Randolph, in answer to a question, "the idea of the Anglo-Saxon was mine originally. I have been thinking very seriously about it for the last six months. There will be nothing political, as you would call it, in the programme of the quarterly. We shall deal with public affairs, literature, science and art. In the sense of a large appeal to Anglo-Saxons, as a community, we shall endeavor to be the means of communicating in the English language ripeness of thought on many subjects. I shall strive to make the magazine attractive, interesting and satisfying. To obtain this end I have endeavored, and with considerable success, to secure contributions from well-known persons on both sides of the Atlantic. Literary excellence will be aimed at as well as authority. In political discussion a balance will be preserved between the two. Science will be touched upon in each number in an interesting, up-to-date manner. I shall have a political summary from Washington in every issue, and one from London, covering the events of each three months. The English summary will be in a sense a review of the entire European field."

STEAMER SCIPPIO TO BE SOLD.

Queer Derelict Was Found by an American Ship—Most Remarkable History.

The steamer Scipio, a craft from nowhere, bound to nowhere, flying no flag, ownerless and crewless, is to be sold to the highest bidder at the Brooklyn navy yard by the United States government.
