Revival of Project to Connect Chicago and New York by Air Line Reducing Time to 16 Hours.

A New York paper says that, stimulated by the boom in railroad earnings and the general condition of prosperity, a group of eastern railroad men and New York financiers are disposed to revive the scheme to construct an air line railroad between New York and Chicago.

Roughly described, this proposed railroad is to extend between New York and Chicago in almost a straight line. It will cut across the northern part of New Jersey, and will pass through the Mauch Chunk coal fields in Pennsylvania.

Passing through Ohio, the road will touch at Cleveland and Toledo, and will pursue nearly a straight course to Chicago, via South Bend. This "air line," its projectors declare, will be more than 300 miles shorter than any other route between the Atlantic seaboard and Chicago, and trains are to be run from New York to Chicago in 16 hours—perhaps a little less.

Provision of New Law Will Tax Their Capacity to Utmost.

Subsidiary Coinage to the Amount of \$300,000 Will Be Added to the Country's Supply—In Much Needed.

The mints of the United States will be busy for some time to come in undertaking to carry out the provision of the act that has just become law and that permits the secretary of the treasury to add \$300,000 to the stock of subsidiary coinage.

The Director of the Mint Roberts, in talking about the objects and usefulness of the new act, said: "The new monetary act, approved March 14, authorizes an increase of about \$300,000 in the stock of subsidiary silver coin. The last authority for the issue of subsidiary silver was given by a joint resolution, approved July 22, 1876, in preparation for the resumption of specie payments. It authorized the issue of an amount which, together with the fractional paper currency outstanding, should at no time exceed \$50,000,000."
