CARE OF DAINTY BELONGINGS.

GOOD HOUSEHOLD REMEDY.

An Article That Should Always Be Found in the Household Medicine Chest.

Powdered rhubarb should always be kept in the house, especially if there are children, says the Home Magazine.

Children should be watched for the first indications of trouble, such as loss of appetite, or headache. Then, if the tongue is not clear and the breath perfectly sweet, the rhubarb and soda ward off a serious illness.

Spiced Tomato Sauce. One can tomatoes, one teaspoonful salt, one chopped onion, one teaspoonful sugar, one-half red pepper, one-quarter cupful of vinegar, one-half teaspoonful of ground cloves, one-half teaspoonful of cinnamon; slowly one hour, then add spice, etc., and cook one-half hour longer.

Lettuce and Cream Cheese Salad. Make a dainty nest of lettuce on each salad plate, sprinkle it with mayonnaise, and place in it a pat of cream cheese with a little golden mayonnaise in the center, to simulate a poached egg. Or the cheese may be molded into egg form, and placed in the nest. The lettuce must be tender and crisp, and kept on ice until just before serving.—Home Magazine.
