HAPPENINGS 69 YEARS AGO.

Our Parish.

How dependent New Orleans is on this parish for its health, its recreation, and its supplies! In every quarter of Lafayette and Jefferson city stately mansions and elegant cottages are being built by business men of New Orleans, to retreat to for a purer atmosphere and more rural enjoyments. Driven out from the city by dust, and heat, and noise, they come to our environs in pursuit of health, quiet, the luxuries of the country with the conveniences of the town. Here are fruits, flowers, fragrant breezes, spreading trees and the fresh grass. Worn down by the wear and tear of trade, disgusted with theatricals, annoyed by street music, and the eternal clangor of cabs and drays, they seek recreation in the shady avenues of Gretna and Greenville, along the verdant lanes of Lafayette or in the magnificent gardens of Carrollton. Upwards of three thousand persons visited that celebrated retreat on Sunday last, and every evening is crowded. The cars and the steamers are thronged with passengers, all bound to some point in Jefferson, for recreation. As to supplies, New Orleans would absolutely starve but for our contributions. Our butchers supply them with meat; their best vegetables go from above Carrollton and the Metairie; their venison, ducks, oysters and fish from Barataria. They never get a young fowl, a fat turkey, a squab or a pound of fresh butter that is not sent from Jefferson. Our bakers supply their best bread, and when they have the good taste to prefer pure, rich milk to chalk and water, they let their own carts jingle, and patronize the milkmen of Lafayette.

The Era of Young Physic.

A writer on medicine, speaking of the great progress made in the science, within the last century, says that the time has passed away when oil from kittens boiled alive, was considered an admirable application for wounds; when toads roasted alive were administered for asthma, and the hair of the mad dog for hydrocephalus; when the powdered thigh bone of an executed felon was considered a specific in dysentery, and ointment was applied to the inflicting weapon in order to cure the wound, when physicians placed confidence in phylacteries, and watched with intense anxiety the influence of black and white days, and the aspect of the stars; and when they hurried their unfortunate patients to an untimely grave, in attempting to quench the fires of fever and inflammation by diligently feeding the flame.

Organization of the Confederate Government.

As little is known at this time regarding the organization of the Government of the Confederate States, says Mr. W. O Hart of the Louisiana Historical Society, a brief reference thereto may prove of interest at this time.

The Confederate Provisional Congress met at Montgomery, Alabama, February 4, 1861, South Carolina, Louisiana, Mississippi, Georgia, Alabama and Florida being represented at the opening, the Texas Delegates appearing later, and a provisional Constitution was adopted on February 8, 1861.

On February 9th, 1861, Jefferson Davis was elected Provisional President and Alexander H. Stephens was elected Provisional Vice-President.

On March 11, 1861, a permanent Constitution was adopted and on July 20, 1861, the capital was removed to Richmond, Virginia.

On November 16, 1861, Davis and Stephens were elected President and Vice-President for terms of six years, and on February 18, 1862, the Congress elected in November assembled.

On February 22, 1862, Davis and Stephens were inaugurated.

The Confederate Cabinet consisted of six members: Secretary of State, Secretary of War, Secretary of the Treasury, Secretary of the Navy, Attorney-General and Postmaster-General; the only Cabinet Officer who served throughout the existence of the Confederacy was Stephen R. Mallory, of South Carolina, Right of Way of L & N R R, Dahlia, Bay and boundary of Edgewood Park near the city of New Orleans, \$250.—Schneidau.
