Mr. Tener is not the only man who has found the cares of office as president of the mother league a weighty burden. He is the eighth president of the league, and at least two of his predecessors figured as the center of internal strife and turmoil that kept them in hot water much of the time.

"This boy Fall, from Oberlin college, can beat anything the world has ever produced in running a mile. He is the greatest distance machine I ever saw, and I've seen a lot of good ones in my time. I had a watch on him in a recent meet in Chicago and his pace from the start to the finish was a dream. It was absolutely perfect in every way.

"Had he gone after a record I am convinced that he could have shattered the existing record held by Tabor, for he would have covered that mile in less than four minutes, eleven seconds. He was so fresh when he finished that no one who had not clocked him would have believed he ran it in 4:16. A score of watches that were held on him agreed within one-fifth of a second on the time.
